News from the Monts Malawi Mission: (posted on Facebook March 16, 2023) Friends, I'm afraid we cannot add much news to that which you have heard in the States regarding the catastrophic floods and mudslides that have killed hundreds of people and destroyed many villages in the southern part of Malawi, home of the Synod of Blantyre.



To be clear, Deb and I are living and serving hours north of Blantyre and haven't even had rain in the past few days.

Sadly, the economic resources in Malawi are so limited, I truly don't know what can or will be done for those who have lost loved ones, who are injured and who se villages have been demolished. I don't want to be unnecessarily negative, but the daily living conditions of a significant majority of Malawians is nearly as hopeless and tragic.

I am hoping to touch base with some leaders withing the Synod of Blantyre in hopes of offering a fundraising effort (you won't be too awfully surprised when you hear about it 4-6 weeks from now), to help raise additional funds for those affected by this recent calamity. For those who wish to donate to immediate relief efforts, please visit the websites of organizations like the Red Cross or Samaritan's Purse that have and continue to serve the least of these in Malawi and other struggling nations.

As for our efforts, as mentioned, every dollar donated to us and our service in Malawi beginning February 1, 2023, will be going exclusively to Malawians who Deb and I know personally whose financial needs are extreme and to ministries serving hospital and palliative care patients, the elderly and disabled. Up to this point, thanks to humbling, thoughtful, generous donations, we've donated over \$4000 to such individuals and ministry mission organizations.

Thank you for your prayers for and the donations to the people of Malawi. Deb and Chuck.

P.S. I did hear this morning at Chapel that more than 300 have died and over 200 are mission, 40,000 homes have been severely damaged or totally destroyed and that some 200,000 are now completely homeless. For those wishing to donate to the relief efforts, I am reminded that Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is present and at work with the Blantyre Synod; donations can be made to PDA through the PCUSA website.
