Easter Blessings be with you, your family, and friends, and neighbors, our nation and all nations.

Since beginning to serve as your Pastor on February 18, I've been visiting and listening to some of the stories of the lives of church members. As with my own family, members' stories include many wonderful, Godblessed times; I've also heard of times of great difficulty and loss. Isn't it extraordinary how we and our families have weathered tough seasons over the years (and continue to face storms of one kind or another

currently and forecast for the months ahead).

So, as people of faith, it should come as no surprise that, periodically, we have some questions about where

God is in the midst of the painful times of our lives.

I wish I had the answers to our faithful questions, solutions for our aching hearts, paths forward that could guarantee complete healing, perfect peace, no more problems. I don't. (I remember thinking when I was a teenager that I would have figured out life's questions and struggles by the time I was 60-years-old – hasn't

happened!)

However, I believe the realities of Jesus' own struggles up to his crucifixion, followed by the Resurrection

miracle of New Life, offer us encouragement on bad days and good days alike.

Somehow, even though Jesus was God from the beginning (John 1:1-5), he experienced ridicule, rejection by his own neighbors and religious leaders, and was tortured and then hung on a cross to die. He didn't live in a divine bubble of protection, comfort, and one simple, successful, smiley day after another. In other words, he, Immanuel, "God-With-Us, experienced the worst the world has to offer any and every other human being who has ever lived. And yet, Jesus was in prayerful, powerful touch with God's loving, inspiring presence even in

the Garden of Gethsemane and on Golgotha.

Knowing the hardships of Jesus' life doesn't make our difficult days disappear; but quite possibly, it demonstrates just how much God understands and empathizes with us and others, and offers us help even in the midst of suffering "because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us" (Romans 5:5). We can't avoid difficulties, no matter how hard we try, no matter how good we are. But the Spirit is the most accepting, helpful, affirming, constructive Counselor imaginable. Spirit,

help us and all your children across the face of the Earth.

And there is Easter—Christ's Resurrection from the dead! God creates HEALING and HOPE and FULNESS OF LIFE out of suffering, and frustration, and death. These are some of the Easter Promises contained in Romans

8: "the Spirit helps us in our weakness," "God works for the good... of all those who have been called


according to God's purpose," and nothing can "separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our




Comfort for the Grieving Heart


The book we are highlighting this month is
