**Property Committee:** Portions of the west wall in the choir room have been patched and repainted. The front entrance fover walls have been patched and repainted. The old ceiling lighting in the basement dining area has been replaced with LED fixtures. A large tree limb from one of our male trees fell across Front Street on August 8th and blocked traffic. Township forces cleared the street and put the debris on our front lawn. Mike's Tree Service was hired to remove the debris (completed August 11) and check the health of the remaining tree. Mike found it to be rotted and full of ants. Property hired him to remove the remaining tree (completed August 18). The stump will be removed later this year.

HENRY H. HALLEY

. Halley's Bible Handbook by Henry H. Halley donated to the church by the Paul Hodes Family.

If you are interested in a reference book that helps you to study the Bible, the book by Henry H. Halley is very helpful. It is not designed as a textbook, but rather as a handy brief manual, of popular nature, for the average Bible reader who has few or no commentaries or reference works on the Bible. However, many Bible classes use it; and many accomplished Bible scholars, possessors of large libraries, have been most cordial in acknowledging its helpfulness. Its usefulness may be enhanced by looking through it a good deal, so as to become familiar in a general way with its contents.

It's filled with interesting facts, dates, maps and archaeological discoveries. Messianic predictions of the Messiah from the old testament from Genesis to Malachi, and much, much more!

Read and enjoy and when finished return the book to the church library so others can enjoy it too.

Also check out other interesting books in the Paul Dryer Library located in Fellowship Hall.

Halley was born in Kentucky in 1874, and graduated from Transylvania University and the College of the Bible in 1895. Halley's career as a preacher began in 1899. [2] Halley began his Bible Handbook in 1924, at

which point it was only a 16-page pamphlet of introductory material, called "Suggestions for Bible Study".
